Opportunities to help!

As you're considering your new year's resolution, think about adding something to your life. The Altar Guild, Flower Guild, and Children's Chapel, as well as Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Intercessors, and Ushers are wonderful opportunities to grow and bring you closer to our Church. There are never too many hands to help and this is a great way to take part in the life of the parish.

The **Altar Guild** tends to the physical items we use in worship, including the hangings and vestments, the linens, candles, brass, and silver. Members of the AG are scheduled to set up and prepare for the Eucharist. The **Flower Guild** prepares the flower arrangements for the altar and usually places additional arrangements near our statue of Mary and on the narthex table.

Volunteers for **Children's Chapel** take turns preparing and leading a brief lesson (provided) for our young children after church during coffee hour. **Eucharistic Ministers** are trained and licensed to assist at the Eucharist, including administering the chalice. **Lectors** read one of the lessons, **Intercessors** read the Prayers of the People, and **Ushers** greet people arriving for worship as well as directing people during Communion.

Those who serve in these positions are scheduled on a rotating basis, usually about once a month.

Lessons and Hymns Sunday, January 1st (Holy Name - Year A)

THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

First Lesson: Numbers 6:22-27. The familiar Jewish blessing is found in the quote from the Book of Numbers.

The Psalm: Psalm 8. God's name is given honor in this psalm; "O Lord our Governor, how exalted is your Name in all the world!"

Second Lesson: Galatians 4:4-7 or Philippians 2:5-11. In the Galatians passage, Paul notes we are "adopted as children" by God. Philippians relates Paul's appeal to reverence the name of Jesus always and everywhere.

The Gospel: Luke 2:15-21. This is the account of Jesus being circumcised and receiving his name, as was the Jewish custom on the eighth day after birth.

THE HYMNS:


Processional Hymn: No. 87. "Hark, the herald angels sing." This is another creation of the prolific hymn writer, Charles Wesley (1707-1788), who was an Anglican priest but associated with other clergy who observed a very methodical manner of observing Christian life and were called "Methodists." Wesley wrote over 6,500 hymns and 500 are in common use. The final verse ends, "Risen with healing in his wings, light and life to all he brings, hail, the Sun of Righteousness! hail, the heavenborn Prince of Peace." The tune, "Mendelssohn," is the second movement of Felix Mendelssohn's (1809-1847) "Festgesang an die Kunstler," (1840). It has been adapted and harmonized here by Geoffrey Turton Shaw (1879-1943).

Sequence Hymn: No. 89. "It came upon the midnight clear." This hymn was composed by Edmund Hamilton Sears (1810-1876) during the time he was the minister to a Unitarian Congregation in Wayland, Massachusetts. The tune, "Carol," was composed by Richard Storrs Willis (1819-1900) in a series of Church Chorales and Choir Studies (c. 1850).

Presentation Hymn: No. 115. "What Child is This." This is another Epiphany hymn by William Chatterton Dix (author of "As With Gladness," Hymn 119). The third verse names the three gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh brought to the Christ child. "Greensleeves" is a traditional English melody believed to trace back to a ballad of 1580 entitled "Lady Greene Sleeves."

Recessional Hymn: No. 99. "Go Tell It on the Mountain." The words and tune for this hymn come from an Afro-American gospel song of the 19th century south. The text was adapted by John W. Work around 1930; and the music was arranged by Horace Clarence Boyer for publication in our 1982 hymnal.
