Thoughts from Lorí

In addition to the three-year lectionary which determines our scriptures on Sunday mornings, there is a one-year calendar of saints days. Some of them are traditional saints - the ones we usually refer to with a capital "S" like St. Paul - and some who are less well known and not officially canonized. The term "saint," by the way, actually refers to all believers, so there's that.

On Wednesdays, I like to pick one of the saints memorialized this week for the Noon Eucharist. Today, for example, is the feast day of St. Vincent de Paul (1580-1660). He is best known for his charitable work, and many Roman Catholic churches use his name for their outreach to the poor. But he also had a profound effect on the education of clergy and the establishment of seminaries. He had a passion for the spiritual development of ordinary people and was famous for his preaching.

At his funeral, the preacher declared that Vincent had "transformed the face of the Church." Here is the Collect for his feast day:

Loving God, we thank you for your servant Vincent de Paul, who gave himself to training clergy to work among the poor and provided many institutions to aid the sick, orphans, and prisoners. May we, like him, encounter Christ in the needy, the outcast, and the friendless, that we may come at length into your kingdom where you reign, one God, holy and undivided Trinity, for ever and ever. Amen.

A Word from the Rev. William P. McLemore

Feast Day of Lancelot Andrewes

Tuesday, September 26th, was the feast day of Lancelot Andrewes. He was an English bishop and scholar who held high positions in the Church of England during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I. During the latter's reign, Andrewes served successively as Bishop of Chichester, or Ely, and of Winchester, and oversaw the translation of the King James Version of the Bible.



Andrewes was a very devout man. One of his most admired works is his "Private Devotions," an anthology from the Scriptures and ancient liturgies, which he compiled for his own use. He vigorously defended the catholicity of the Church of England against Roman Catholic critics, and promoted an orthodox theology of the Holy Eucharist and many church sacraments.

As his student, and later Bishop of Lichfield, John Hacket wrote about Andrewes: "Indeed he was the most Apostolical and Primitive-like Divine, in my Opinion, that wore a Rochet in his Age; of a most venerable Gravity, and yet most sweet in all Commerce; the most Devout that I ever saw, when he appeared before god; of such a Growth in all kind of Learning that very able Clerks were of a low Stature to him."

What we learn from Lancelot Andrewes is that faith is a journey which ever seeks perfection. We also learn the value of patience, prayer, and genuine love toward God, and God's saving grace as we live from day to day.
