Lori's Stewardship Sermon

This was my sermon last Sunday, a stewardship sermon, as requested by Barb Moriarty, our Steward Chair for 2018-19.

Pentecost XXII (Proper 24 B)
October 21, 2018
St. Paul's McHenry

May the words of my mouth and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, our strength and our redeemer. *Amen*.

Michael and I were unlikely friends. We were in discernment together back in the early '80s. I was a suburban housewife and mother; he was a soft-spoken young man living in his parents' basement apartment. I went on to seminary and Michael went to graduate school and earned a master's degree in community counseling.

He came to terms with his sexuality and "came out" in a time when that was not well-received. Though not destined to become a priest, he found his vocation as a therapist and was one of the first counselors to serve the gay community during the height of the AIDS epidemic.

His vocation was every bit as sacred as the priesthood. He died of AIDS himself just a couple of years later. He was as much a saint as any of those disciples, as any of those across the ages we call Saints with a capital S.

When I was ordained, 30 years ago this December, he gave me a manuscript – a piece of calligraphy with gold leaf – which reads "You are a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek." I cherish it and it has hung on the wall of my office in every church I've ever served.

Lessons and Hymns for this Sunday, October 28, 2018

(Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost- Year B) by the Rev. William P. McLemore

THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

<u>The Old Testament:</u> Jeremiah 31:7-9. The Lord God will gather the tribes of Israel to "walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble." <u>Psalm 126.</u> This passage of the psalter echoes the restoration of Israel in Jeremiah. The Epistle: Hebrews 7:23-28. Jesus is portrayed as a priest forever because he is the eternal son of God. <u>The</u> Gospel: Mark 10:46-52. This is the story of Jesus healing the blind beggar Bartimaeus.

THE HYMNS:

<u>Processional:</u> No. 411. "O Bless the Lord My Soul." This hymn was written by James Montgomery and is based upon Psalm 103. The text has been in our hymnals since 1826 without any alterations over the years. The tune "St. Thomas" was composed by Aaron Williams and is used in its abbreviated form for this hymn. The words call forth our faith in the deepest sense, "O bless the Lord my soul."

<u>Sequence</u>: No. 671. "Amazing Grace, How Sweet the Sound." "Amazing Grace" is a hymn written by the English poet and clergyman John Newton (1725–1807), published in 1779. It is one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world. Newton grew up without any particular religious conviction. He was pressed into the Royal Navy, and after leaving the service became involved in the Atlantic slave trade. In 1748, a violent

storm battered his vessel so severely that he called out to God for mercy, a moment that marked his spiritual conversion. "Amazing Grace" was written to illustrate a sermon on New Year's Day of 1773. The tune "New Britain" has been traced back to "Southern Harmony," a shaped note hymnbook published in 1847 published by William Walker which sold 600,000 copies. The hymn is a wonderful testimony of personal faith. "Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved; how precious did that grace appear the hour I first believed."

<u>Presentation</u>: No. 679. "Surely it is God who Saves Me." Based on the First Song of Isaiah, this popular contemporary hymn was composed by the Rev. Dr. Carl Pickens Daw, Jr., before he studied at the University of the South and was ordained an Episcopal priest in March of 1982. He served on the Committee on Texts for the 1982 Hymnal and currently lives in Watertown, Maine. The tune was composed by Ray W. Urwin.

<u>Communion:</u> "In the Lord I'll be forever thankful." This hymn was written and set to music by Jacques Breathier for the Taize religious community in France. 1991. It is based on Philippians 4:4-6.

Recessional: No. 535. "Ye Servants of God." Charles Wesley, the son of Samuel Wesley, was born at Epworth, Dec. 18, 1708. He was educated at Westminster School and afterwards at Christ Church, Oxford, where he graduated M.A. In 1735, he took Orders and immediately proceeded with his brother John to Georgia, both being employed as missionaries of the Society of the Propagation of the Gospel of the Church of England. He returned to England in 1736. For many years he engaged with his brother in preaching the Gospel. He died March 29, 1788. This great hymn calls forth our outreach, sharing Christ with others—a prominent aspect of the Epiphany season. This spirited tune is from a 1765 melody in a German Catholic hymnal.
