LOVE AND FREEDOM

Our Epistle reading this Sunday is from the Book of Revelation where we hear that Jesus “loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood...” (Revelation 1:5c)

Without love, there can be no freedom; and without freedom, there can be no love. This is the message of the Cross of Christ—God so loves our world that he gave his only Son freely into the human world. In Our Lord’s death and resurrection we find the most profound definition of love and the necessary freedom it requires.

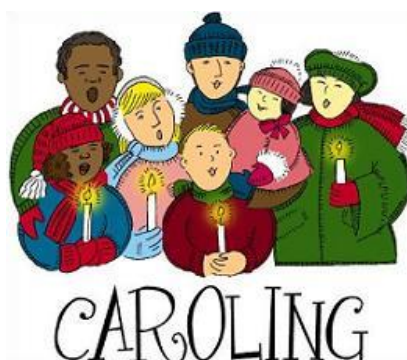
Jesus offers the summary of the Law when he is asked about how we should relate to God: “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it, you shall love your neighbor as yourself.” Loving God is allowing God to be free to be God in all aspects of our lives—heart, soul, and mind. Loving ourselves as our neighbors is allowing ourselves and our neighbors to be who they are with judging, manipulating, or assuming ownership of them.

Lessons and Hymns for this Sunday, November 25, 2018

(Last Sunday after Pentecost - Year B)

THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

The Old Testament: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14. Daniel sees the Ancient One as God on the throne of heaven and a human being approaching on the clouds of heaven as an anointed son. *Psalms* 93. "The Lord is King; he has put on splendid apparel." *The Epistle:* Revelation 1:4b-8. God is described as the "Alpha and the Omega" who "is and who was and who is to come." *The Gospel:* John 18:33-37. This tells the story of Jesus before Pontius Pilate who questions the savior about being a king. Jesus tells him that his kingdom is not of this world.

THE HYMNS:

Processional: No. 365. "Come Thou Almighty King." Students of hymnody have searched far and wide for the true author of this hymn. Some feel it has the composition style of Charles Wesley's music. The 1982 hymnal simply calls it "Anonymous" (ca. 1757). The first three verses present each person of the Trinity and the final verse begins, "To thee, great one in three."

Sequence: No. 435. "At the Name of Jesus." This hymn was written by Caroline Maria Noel as processional music for Ascension Day. It is based on Philippians 2:9-10 which speaks of bowing the knee before Christ. Some biblical scholars think that St. Paul himself quoted it from an early Christian hymn. The tune, "King's Weston" was composed by Ralph Vaughan Williams in 1925 expressly for this hymn.

Presentation: No. 556. "Rejoice Ye Pure in Heart." This hymn was written by Edward Hayes Plumptre in May 1865 for the annual choir festival at Peterborough Cathedral. Plumptre was chaplain of King's College (1847-1868) and attained considerable respect as a translator as well as author of Biblical criticism, history, biography, and poetry. The tune, "Marion" was composed by Arthur Henry Messiter in 1883 and set to this text in a hymnal he produced ten years later.

Communion: "In the Lord I'll be forever thankful." This hymn was written and set to music by Jacques Breathier for the Taize religious community in France. 1991. It is based on Philippians 4:4-6.

Recessional: No. 544. "Jesus Shall Reign." There are about a dozen hymns in our hymnal that are my favorite and this one is close to the top of the list. Isaac Watts (1674-1748) created this happy and joyful song based on Psalm 72. The imagery of the risen Christ is certainly found in the words of this hymn, especially the 4th verse, "the prisoners leap to lose their chains." The tune "Duke Street," composed by John Hatton (d. 1793) is easy to sing and reflects the joy of Easter in its melody.

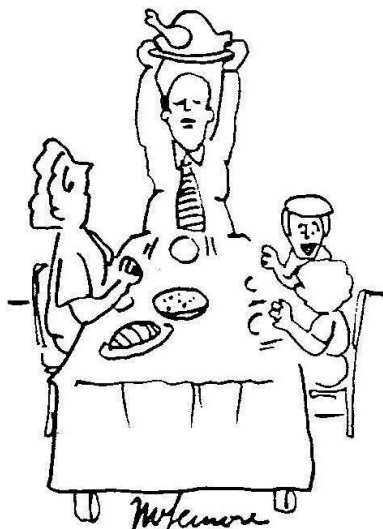

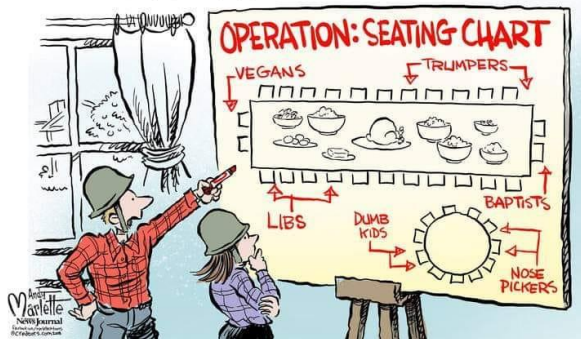
