# Thoughts from Lori

Happy New Year! No, not that new year. It's the new year in the church calendar, beginning this coming Sunday, which is the First Sunday of Advent. The first thing you'll notice when you arrive for worship will be the liturgical color: blue. (It's called Marian blue, by the way, for the lapis blue associated with the mother of Jesus.)

You'll notice, too, that we will be using **Rite One** for the Eucharist, including the appropriate service music. Since Advent is considered a penitential season – not in the same way that we think of Lent, but nevertheless a season of somber waiting – there will be no flowers at the altar, only greens.

There will be a special **Advent handout for children**. It's an activity booklet and new crayons that they can take home. At Coffee & Conversation, there will be two options: a table for folks who simply want a cup of coffee and a chance to chat, which is quite fine; and at another table we'll be offering "**The Way of Love**," which is offered by our Presiding Bishop, the Most Reverend Michael Curry. It is designed to enrich our spiritual lives through a practice of prayer and reading scripture.

Take dear good care of yourselves. It's a season when we can so easily get caught up in the secular frenzy leading up to Christmas. Instead, may the season of Advent offer us all an opportunity for peaceful anticipation as we await the birth of the Christ child.

## The usual fare...

### Lessons and Hymns for this Sunday, December 2, 2018

(First Sunday of Advent - Year C) by the Rev. William P. McLemore

### THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

**The Old Testament:** Jeremiah 33:14-16. The prophet speaks of the day that is coming when a righteous branch will be raised. **Psalm 25:1-9.** "Show me your ways, O Lord, and teach me your paths." **The Epistle:** I Thessalonians 3:9-13. St. Paul reflects his love for his congregation in Thessalonica and urges them to love one another. **The Gospel:** Luke 21:25-36. Jesus tells of the coming day of the Lord and calls for his disciples to be alert for the signs of this coming.

#### THE HYMNS:

**Processional:** No. 66. "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus." One of many hymns by Charles Wesley, this was Hymn No. 1 in the 1940 Hymnal. The text beautifully describes the basic theology of Advent — the coming of Jesus, human hope, deliverance, and the enthronement of Jesus Christ as King. The tune, "Stuttgart," is in the 87 87 meter and attributed to Christian Friedrich Witt (1660-1716), a well-known German composer.

**Sequence:** No. 75. "There's a Voice in the Wilderness." This hymn was written by James Lewis Milligan (1876-1961), a Methodist layman born in England who immigrated to Canada early in life. He was a poet, newspaper editor, and speech writer. This hymn is based upon Matthew 3:3 relating the message of John the Baptist preparing the way of the Lord. The tune, "Ascension," was composed by Henry Hugh Bancroft (1904-1988), a British organist and composer who migrated to Canada in 1929. There is a good chance that he knew the author of this hymn and wrote the tune specifically for it.

**Presentation:** No. 601. "O Day of God Draw Nigh." This hymn was written by Robert Balgarnie Young Scott for the Fellowship of Christian Social Order in 1937. It is based loosely on Zechariah 1:14-18 in that it calls for a restored faith as part of the expected Day of the Lord.

**Communion:** "O Lord, Hear My Prayer." This is another Taize community musical paraphrase to a psalm (102:1-2). It was set to music by Jacques Bertheir (1923-1994) in 1991, shortly before he died. The Psalm reads, "Lord, hear my prayer, and let my cry come before you; hide not your face from me in the day of my trouble."

**Recessional:** No. 68. "Rejoice, Rejoice, Believers." This hymn is a poetic cento from Laurentius Laurenti's "Evangelica Melodica" (1700). It was translated by Sarah Findlater and appeared in her "Hymns from the Land of Luther" (1854). The imagery relies on the parable of the bridegroom found in Matthew 25:1-13. From the second verse: "The marriage feast is waiting, the gates wide open stand; rise up ye heirs of glory, the Bridegroom is at hand." The 1982 Hymnal applies a different tune to this hymn than the 1940 edition. It's a Welsh air named "Llangloffan."
