Despite our separation and the strangeness of our days, your vestry has been hard at work addressing the financial concerns of our parish. As you recall, several of our annual and quarterly meetings have provided an opportunity to present and discuss our issues. Overwhelmingly the option to sell our building has stood out as the decision that makes sense and will ensure the continuation of St. Paul's community.

In adherence to Canon Law your vestry has begun the first steps toward this option. This week all parishioners eligible to vote will receive a letter outlining the plan to be followed by a ballot for your vote. The vestry will also schedule a virtual meeting for discussion and questions.

This is a significant moment in the history of St. Paul's and it is a moment that will define us. Our faith, our courage and our resolve will no doubt be tested. I believe we will overcome this test if we but remember who we are, remember God's love for us, our love for each other and utterly refuse to be afraid.

This Sunday we will celebrate Pentecost; the day the Holy Spirit was breathed upon the infant church. The apostles had no idea what it meant for them or for their future. That same Holy Spirit is upon us today and will never leave us. We are forging new ground toward a new future – a future that holds nothing less than God's love. In Christ.
