#### From Deacon Deb

The gospel reading for this Sunday is from Matthew 22:1-14. In this familiar parable, Jesus gives the example of a king who holds a lavish wedding feast for his son and the guests refuse to come. In his frustration and anger, the king invites strangers from the streets and then his banquet hall is filled with guests. The one particular person of interest is the one who comes to the banquet not wearing a wedding robe. This one is thrown out with dire consequences.

Jesus often uses the imagery and words associated with a wedding. He does this especially when describing the Kingdom of God. Perhaps one of His reasons is that a wedding is a happy and joyous occasion. A wedding celebrates the love between two people that is so strong that it unites families, forms new bonds. A wedding holds the promise of new life and as such is much more than the sum of its parts. A wedding is held out to us as an abundant gift.

In the parable, the guests that refused to come are those too occupied with their own lives to recognize the gift that is being offered. Sadly, they will never know what they are missing. The one who comes not wearing a wedding robe is symbolic of those who will not shed their old clothes, will not change their old way for the promise of the new. They are willing to partake, yet unwilling to give.

As I contemplate what this parable is saying to me I am filled with a renewed commitment to our parish. It seems we are being given an invitation to step out in faith and celebrate the love of God that is so strong it unites us. God invites us to the wedding feast each moment of our lives. With each breath we are given a choice to refuse, to stay in our old ways, or to put on the garment of Christ and dance.

By the grace of God may we all choose to dance.
