Friends,

From the moment we began considering the sale of our building we were aware of the sensitive nature of the future of St. Paul's Columbarium. No one anticipated that the sale would be complete within a two month period. We did anticipate that notifying families with an interest in the columbarium and subsequent re-internment would take time. As such, it was negotiated with our buyer that we would have 12 months from the date of closing to complete these tasks.

We have sought the input of experts to determine what is necessary to facilitate the removal of cremains in a prayerful and respectful manner that honors all concerned. I have contacted the McHenry County Coroner's Office, the McHenry County Public Health Department and several local Funeral Directors. We have asked our attorney to review state and local ordinances. So far we have learned that much depends upon the decision of the family for future internment.

We are contacting other Episcopal churches with a columbarium to determine if they have niches available and their process. We intend to provide families with a resource of options available. We will work with each family on an individual basis to tend to each particular need.

Our next priority is to contact families and individuals regarding next steps. In the meantime, we ask that you give your plans some thought and contact the church office with any questions and concerns.

We are all saddened by the need to move those who were resting in peace. Please pray for God's guidance and grace as we move through this delicate time.
