From Deacon Deb

The Gospel reading for this Sunday is taken from the Gospel of John. The priests and Levites have come to John the Baptist to discover who this man, to whom the crowds are flocking, might be. They ask him "Who are you?" John denies being anyone of importance. He is not the Messiah; he is not a great prophet. He says, "I am the voice..." John claims no identity apart from the will of God. John then tells them "Among you stands one whom you do not know." *John 1:26b*

This reading is all about identity. Who are we? Who is Jesus?

These are deeply important questions; it may be a mistake to think we know the answers. One drawback of familiarity with church and scripture is that we can fall into the malaise of hearing it all before; we know how the story goes and ends. This is literally a spiritual dead end. Do we really know Jesus? We know of him and we know about him but

is this enough? I believe that one of the great tasks of Advent is to stop us in our tracks and confront us with the truth that among us stands one whom we do *not* know.

By the grace of God, this truth is not cause for dismay. The good news is Jesus IS *among us*. Jesus is ever among us with a heart flung wide open to receive and love us. Jesus stands among us, ever present, just waiting to be known. The invitation to know our Lord Jesus is always always there. All we need do is let go of all that we think we know, make time each day to sit in silence and welcome Jesus with our hearts flung wide open.


