Today, January 6, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany, which marks the end of the twelve days of Christmas. Epiphany is a Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "appearing."

At the Feast of the Epiphany we celebrate Jesus being made manifest as the Christ. The most widely celebrated manifestation is Jesus revealed as Christ to the Magi who followed the Star of Bethlehem at his birth. Interestingly, the bible doesn't mention how many wise men there were - just that three gifts were given and that they came from the east. They were likely to have been Zoroastrian Priests. It wasn't until about 500AD that three was accepted as the number of wise men - the reasoning simply due to the number of gifts. It is said the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh represent the gold for his kingly crown, frankincense for his adoration and myrrh for his shroud. The traditional names of the three kings are Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar, who are said to represent Europe, Arabia and Africa.


