I've learned that God works through everyday experiences.

The woman came into the library, clutching two oversized manila envelopes stuffed with papers. She glanced at the massive fax/copier machine in the front of the library and then at me. I recognized the frazzled look above her mask, "the I'm in a hurry and I don't know how to work this machine" look. Though she couldn't see my smile, she heard my "do you need help" inquiry and hopefully saw my "smiling eyes" above my mask.

She sighed with relief and began to pull out crinkled papers from the envelopes. Her hands were jittery as she sorted the double sided sheets from the single sided ones. There were 60+ pages to be faxed and as I straightened and flattened each sheet, I explained that the faxing process would take a bit of time. She nodded and I noticed she was a little breathless so I suggested she take a seat on a nearby chair.

As I started the fax, she told me that she was recovering from liver surgery and explained that half of her liver had been removed. The woman gave no other details about the "why" and I didn't ask. She then said it was just recently that x-rays had shown that her liver was regenerating. I expressed my happiness for her great news and then assumed that she was faxing medical information to her insurance company. We listened a while to the whine of the fax machine, then she spoke again. What I had assumed was a medical fax, wasn't.

The woman is a companion to an elderly lady who is losing her rented apartment. Because the housing authority is closed due to COVID restrictions all applications for housing aid had to be faxed. She said that the backup in applications is mind boggling. All that this woman has been through medically and she is deeply involved in helping another person.

I work in the library's back office and usually only go out to the public area for about an hour to help cover lunches. What were the chances the woman would come into the library during my small shift out front? How many other good works are happening around us every day that go unnoticed? Sometimes it is the small good works that make a lasting impression on a person.

"God bless you" the woman said as she walked out of the library. "and to you also" I replied.




