
### Worship at St. Paul's In-person and at home Sundays at 8:30 am

The checkout line, though jammed, was calm. Those with few plants were encouraged by those with overflowing carts to step in front of them. Seeing the politeness of complete strangers to one another was overwhelming. As I walked back to my car I was again enveloped with an aura of happiness. I unloaded my plants and turned to see a couple getting out of their car. I gave them my cart.

#### From Deacon Deb

Take nothing for the journey...

In Sunday's gospel reading Jesus sends the disciples out into the world to do his ministry of healing and teaching. Jesus gives them some very specific instructions before they go on their way. "Take nothing for the journey...no bread, no bag, no money. Wear sandals but

not an extra tunic..." (Mark 6:8-9) In short, do *not*, in any way, prepare for the journey. These must have seemed like harsh restrictions given the territory and danger of traveling in those days. The disciples were walking through the rugged Judean countryside. They could not depend on a McDonalds or Kwik-Trip to provide sustenance. Nor could they depend upon conveniently located roadside inns. They were completely on their own without even a bite of bread. Jesus was very clear; take nothing - just go.

We can't help but wonder why Jesus would be so adamant? Why would he send them out with nothing to fall back on? What was he trying to teach them? Perhaps he is providing the disciples with a valuable opportunity to grow in faith. Clearly, their success or failure would not depend on their well thought out plans or preparations. They had to trust in God and God alone.

Jesus seems to be giving us an opportunity as well. As we discern our next ministry/outreach project, this gospel has much to say to us. The blessing does not lie with planning, preparation and concerning ourselves with how it will all turn out. The blessing lies in going and doing. Just go.

Go and do the work of Jesus, trusting in God and God alone.


