For all the Saints

Friends, starting with this edition of our Epistle, I would like to bring to our attention a saint that is remembered during the week. As a rule, we hardly ever talk about those who have gone before who hold the designation of "saint". We tend to think of them as quite other worldly or belonging to another time and place. The fact is, saints were those among us who knew the great love of God and how far they were from perfection. They lived with courage, facing the complexities of life with purpose. Purpose, not perfection, was their hallmark. Many saints were failures in the eyes of the world. What made them saints was their love and faithfulness.

February 13 – Blessed Absalom Jones (1746-1818)

Born into slavery in Sussex, Delaware.

• Taught himself to read and write; and with the permission of his owner, attended a Quaker school.

He married a slave woman named Mary and bought her freedom in 1768.

He bought his own freedom in 1784 after several failed attempts.

 \cdot $\,$ During the Revolutionary War became a lay preacher at St. George's Methodist Church.

In 1787 founded the Free African Society to support woman and children in need.

• After the Methodist church separated from the Anglican Church, St. Thomas Episcopal Church became the first black church in America.

• Was ordained in 1802 although the Diocesan Convention ruled that neither Jones or lay representatives of St. Thomas Church would be allowed to participate in the convention.

• Parish records show a total of 246 members at its organization and grew to 427 within a year. During 23 years as rector, Jones baptized 1195 people.

• He was greatly loved by his people and affectionately called "the Black Bishop of the Episcopal Church."

Died peacefully in his home in 1818 at the age of 71.

Compline – On Tuesday nights in Lent, please join St. Mary's for Compline. Compline is descended from the night prayers said before bed at the end of the monastic round of daily prayer. Midweek Mass (Rite 1) at St. Mary's Crystal Lake starting March 1

On Wednesdays in Lent, take time out of your day to celebrate Holy Eucharist. This service will be a simple, spoken service using traditional language (also known as Rite 1). The service will begin promptly at noon and will last around 30 minutes. This is an excellent, simple Lenten discipline to help you pause midweek and remember God's work in your life. This service is a good way to experience a new type of Eucharist if you've never heard a traditional language Mass, or to revisit the traditional-language Eucharists of earlier years if you are a long-time Episcopalian. *Details: Wednesdays* (beginning March 1), noon, St. Mary's Episcopal Church, Crystal Lake.

Simple Supper and Stations of the Cross at St. Ann's, Woodstock, starting March 2

On Thursdays in Lent join us for a simple supper (usually salad and soup) at 6 pm, followed by Stations of the Cross at 6:30. Stations will end by 7. You can come for supper and stay for stations, or just come for one of the two. Over the course of Lent we will use traditional Stations of the Cross, but will also pray using some variations of the traditional stations, so try coming for several weeks in a row! This ancient practice has a way of working on your soul, and is a meaningful Lenten discipline. *Details: Thursdays* (**beginning March 2**), 6 pm, St. Ann's Episcopal Church, Woodstock


