
Our next outing will be Thursday, March 2 at 11:30 am. We'll gather at Bulldog Alehouse in McHenry. Hope to see you there!

For all the Saints

Saint Polycarp of Smyrna, c. 69 - c. 155

Saint Polycarp was a disciple of St. John the Evangelist, and his life marked the transition between the Apostolic Age and the patristic age of the early Christians. He is the last acknowledged survivor of those who had personally known one of the Apostles.

- · Was made Bishop of Smyrna (now the west coast of Turkey) by Saint John in 96 A.D.
- It is believed that the words in the Revelation to John which are addressed to the "angel" of the church of Smyrna refer to Polycarp. (Rev. 2:8)
- At the age of 86, violent persecution of Christians broke out. Polycarp was betrayed and rejected the opportunity to escape, saying "God's will be done." He met the police at the door and offered them supper while he prayed.
- Polycarp refused to swear by the divinity of Caesar. When threatened with wild beasts or fire, the old bishop said, "I am resolved not to change from good to evil. Why do you delay? Bring against me what you please."
- · When the fire pile was made ready, Polycarp removed his outer clothes and shoes. When his executioners tried to tie him to the stake he said, "Leave me as I am. He who gives me grace to endure the fire will enable me to remain at the stake unmoved."
- After he died, Christians who witnessed the death wrote, "We took up the bones, more precious than the richest jewels of gold, and laid them decently in a place at which God granted us to assemble with joy to celebrate the birthday of the martyr."
- \cdot The record of Polycarp's martyrdom is the earliest preserved reliable account of a Christian martyr's death.

Compline – On Tuesday nights in Lent, please join St. Mary's for Compline. Compline is descended from the night prayers said before bed at the end of the monastic round of daily prayer. Midweek Mass (Rite 1) at St. Mary's Crystal Lake starting March 1

On Wednesdays in Lent, take time out of your day to celebrate Holy Eucharist. This service will be a simple, spoken service using traditional language (also known as Rite 1). The service will begin promptly at noon and will last around 30 minutes. This is an excellent, simple Lenten discipline to help you pause midweek and remember God's work in your life. This service is a good way to experience a new type of Eucharist if you've never heard a traditional language Mass, or to revisit the traditional-language Eucharists of earlier years if you are a long-time Episcopalian. *Details: Wednesdays* (beginning March 1), noon, St. Mary's Episcopal Church, Crystal Lake.

Simple Supper and Stations of the Cross at St. Ann's, Woodstock, starting March 2

On Thursdays in Lent join us for a simple supper (usually salad and soup) at 6 pm, followed by Stations of the Cross at 6:30. Stations will end by 7. You can come for supper and stay for stations, or just come for one of the two. Over the course of Lent we will use traditional Stations of the Cross, but will also pray using some variations of the traditional stations, so try coming for several weeks in a row! This ancient practice has a way of working on your soul, and is a meaningful Lenten discipline. *Details: Thursdays* (beginning March 2), 6 pm, St. Ann's Episcopal Church, Woodstock
