For all the Saints

Blessed John Donne, 1572-1631

John Donne was born a Catholic during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. He was educated at home under Catholic tutors until the age of 12 when he entered Hart Hall, Oxford. He left three years

later as he was not willing to take the Oath of Supremacy which recognized Queen Elizabeth as the Supreme Head of the Church of England. However, by 1568 he decided to conform to the Church of England and became the private secretary to the Lord Chancellor, Sir Thomas Egerton. • Donne was on his way to a remarkable diplomatic career when he made the strategic error of secretly marrying the underage niece of the Chancellor's wife. Donne was fired and thrown into prison. The best man and priest were also imprisoned.

• Then followed years of scant employment opportunities. Donne, his wife and growing family (one child per year), lived in poverty, relying on the charity of friends.

• Donne took up writing satirical and controversial essays to support his family. His writing brought him to the attention of the Bishop of Durham, Sir Robert Drury, and King James.

• He attended to the King in the year after Queen Elizabeth died and he and the King became friends. King James pointedly suggested that Donne be ordained, and finally, after three years of delaying, he allowed himself to be ordained in 1614. He was immediately given the post of royal chaplain.

• Donne thanked God for his experience of poverty which he stated gave him the opportunity to feed on God in his Sacrament. His conversion was deep and sincere and soon he became famous for his preaching.

 \cdot In 1615, Donne visited Cambridge to discover the King had arranged for him to be awarded the degree of Doctor of Divinity.

That same year, his wife died leaving him with seven surviving children. Donne took an oath to 'never bring his children under the subjection of a step-mother'. He kept his oath and never married again. His children were cared for by his mother. The loss of his much-loved wife brought him to a new depth of spirituality.

• In 1621, the King made Donne the Dean of Saint Paul's Cathedral in London. He preached there, at the royal court and all the major festivals. His preaching became famous nationwide. He was easily credited with being the greatest preacher of the age.

• On February 12, 1631, the first Friday in Lent, Donne, although grievously ill, preached his final sermon before the King.

• Although a man of the church, he is perhaps best known for his poetry. His poem "For Whom the Bell Tolls" is one of his most well-known works.

Each man's death diminishes me, For I am involved in mankind. Therefore, send not to know For whom the bell tolls, It tolls for thee.

John Donne died on March 31 and was buried in Saint Paul's. His monument, and his alone, survived the Great Fire of London in 1666.
